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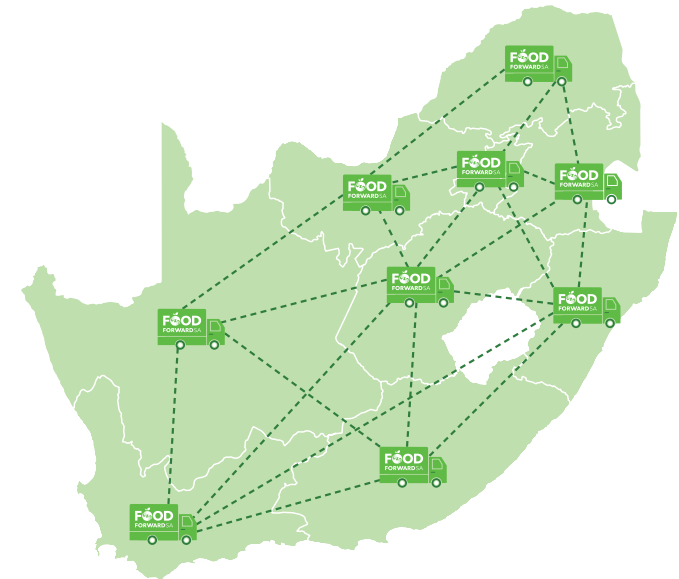
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## ABOUT US

### Vision

A South Africa without hunger.

### Mission

To reduce hunger in South Africa by safely and cost-effectively securing quality food and making it available to those who need it.

### Our Work

Millions of people across South Africa experience food insecurity and malnutrition, while one-third (10 million tons) of all the food we produce is lost or wasted.

FoodForward SA is the largest NPO in South Africa addressing food insecurity and food waste. We recover edible surplus food, which may not be sellable but is still perfectly edible, from farmers, manufacturers, retailers, and other representatives across the food system.

More than 2,750 vetted beneficiary organisations (BOs) receive nutritious food each month from FoodForward SA. These organisations offer vital community services and healthy meals to almost 1 million vulnerable people.

By recovering edible surplus food from the food system, we can:

1. Reduce food insecurity and malnutrition
2. Use surplus food as a catalyst to build resilient communities
3. Reduce the harmful impact of food loss and waste on the environment



## OUR PROGRAMMES

Our programmes promote food security; reduce malnutrition; reduce the impact of food loss and waste on the environment; and advance the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).



### Warehouse Foodbanking

Using our fleet, we recover edible surplus food from our food system partners. This food is brought into our warehouses, carefully sorted, stored, and redistributed.



### FoodShare

Our digital platform, FoodShare, virtually connects BOs to retail stores and food outlets for the regular collection of safe, edible surplus food.



### Mother and Child Nutrition

We provide nutritious food parcels to targeted households where pregnant and nursing mothers, and children up to 5 years are malnourished.



### Mobile Rural Depots

We identify vulnerable rural towns and villages across South Africa for BOs to collect bulk food groceries at central locations.



### School Breakfast

In partnership with various corporates, we provide nutritious food to children in selected primary and secondary schools.



### Disaster Relief

We timeously and effectively respond to various disasters affecting vulnerable communities.



### Sustainable Livelihoods

We work with various partners and communities to create pathways out of poverty, and stimulate economic opportunities for unemployed youth and women.

## OUR IMPACT ACROSS SOUTH AFRICA

More than 85% of our BO network offer vital, life-saving services such as education, skills development, healthcare, and care for vulnerable women and children in under-served communities. The food we provide each month acts as a catalyst to build resilience in vulnerable communities.
